



Georgia Educators!

You are invited to join some 300 paddling enthusiasts and river lovers for **Paddle Georgia 2009, June 20-26** on the Coosawattee and Oostanaula Rivers. Along the way we will offer educators certificate workshops in **Adopt-A-Stream** and **Project WET** to help you bring your experiences back to your students.

Paddle Georgia 2009 is a weeklong, 92-mile canoe/kayak voyage down the Coosawattee and Oostanaula rivers from Ellijay to Rome. Participants will paddle an average of 13 miles each day and along the way visit historic sites, state parks and natural areas. Each night, participants will be shuttled to campsites at local schools and other facilities where educational programs, games, entertainment and meals will be provided.

Project WET (Water Education for Teachers) is a K-12 water education program consisting of over 90 classroom-ready activities. By participating in this workshop, you will receive the Project WET Curriculum and Activity Guide and be a certified WET educator. Project WET will partner with Georgia Adopt-A-Stream training to bring out the best in your river experience. **Adopt-A-Stream** is Georgia's premier volunteer water monitoring program. Training sessions in Project WET and Adopt-A-Stream will be held over several days during the weeklong paddling adventure. Certified instructors through Georgia's Environmental Protection Division will conduct both workshops and each participant will receive 1 PLU for 10 hours of contact time. Paddle Georgia Educator's Scholarships will be offered to 10 applicants with preference given to educators residing in the Coosawattee-Oostanaula river basin. Scholarships will be awarded after review of all applications. Previous scholarship recipients are not eligible to apply. **Application Deadline: Postmarked April 21.** Winners of scholarship will be announced by April 27.

With assistance from the Mohawk Carpet Foundation and Oglethorpe Power, Georgia River Network is providing 10 full scholarship to Georgia educators. These scholarships include the trip's \$195 registration fee and the Project WET curriculum material. The scholarship DOES NOT include meal fees or fees for kick off or river's end shuttles or other services. Participating educators must paddle the entire seven-day, 92-mile Paddle Georgia course and participate in all 10 hours of contact time associated

with Project WET and Adopt-A-Stream. You will have the opportunity to participate in all other Paddle Georgia activities as well. Scholarship winners are responsible for providing their own boats and camping gear. See www.garivers/paddlegeorgia/pghome.html for more details on the event.

Paddle Georgia 2009 will take place June 20-26. Participants will gather Friday morning June 19 for the initial Project WET training course and for the Kick Off Celebration and Feast in Ellijay and will end the trip June 26 at Rome with the River's End Celebration and Feast. - ❖ Get certified as a Georgia Adopt-A-Stream Citizen Water Monitor
- ❖ Earn 1 Professional Learning Unit (PLU)
- ❖ Paddle 92 miles and have one great time!
- ❖ Better educate and inspire your students to be stewards of Georgia's water resources
